This additional funding enables the school to provide 1:1 remedial tuition, hold regular Family Learning sessions, invest in digital technologies to support pupil learning and fund additional teaching assistant support. We also strive to identify opportunities to enrich the learning experiences of those children eligible for the Pupil Premium.

The Senior Leadership Team and Governors at Preston Primary School regularly evaluate the Pupil Premium spending and the impact of the grant. Whole-school tracking of pupils' progress and analysis of the data is carried out, to identify children who are at risk of underachievement, and specifically focus on the progress of pupils entitled to the Pupil Premium.

Service Pupil Premium (SPP)

The SPP is there for schools to provide mainly pastoral support for service children, whereas the Pupil Premium was introduced to raise attainment and accelerate progress within disadvantaged groups. We give each of our children in receipt of the SPP an opportunity to develop a small diary or scrapbook where they can detail their achievements or daily/ weekly activities as they go along which can then be shown to the deployed parent on their return. Every teacher is aware of who their service children are and close pastoral support is provided for these children should they require it courtesy of a dedicated member of staff as well as from individual class teachers. A service children's club; The Invincibles, runs weekly, providing an opportunity for children from military families to talk through their experience and enjoy a range of educational activities in a supportive environment.

Details of how the previous year's Pupil Premium Grant was spent can be viewed by looking at the spread sheet we have on our website. The overwhelming majority of our pupils in respect of whom grant funding was allocated have made good progress in the core areas of maths and English.
