Dear Parents,

Educational Visit to Kilve Court Residential Education Centre

We are now in receipt of the final paperwork and can forward the following arrangements and information to you.

The children will be following a packed activity programme from morning through to bedtime, including evening activities.

Travel arrangements

Wednesday 11th June 2025

Arrive at school at 8am and congregate with luggage in the school playground where registration will take place (or the school hall if it's wet). Parents may stay until the bus departs or leave their child/children with a member of staff.

Depart 8.30am prompt from Preston Primary for Kilve Court Residential Centre, accompanied by Mr Branch, Miss Moorhouse, Mrs Brant, Mrs Chislett & Miss Johnstone. **All** children will need a packed lunch (this includes those entitled to a free school meal), which will be eaten shortly after we arrive before our first activity.

Friday 13th June 2025

Depart from Kilve Court Residential Centre after lunch at 3pm; arrive back at Preston Primary School at approximately 4:30pm.

Medication/Travel Sickness Tablets

If your child requires any medication during the visit, please go straight to the school office area on the morning of the visit from 7.45am and give in a named bag (including inhalers x 2) to Mr Branch. Any boxes containing medication within the bag must also be labelled with your child's name. This medication should correspond with the details already given on the completed medical form.

NB. Kilve Court requests that any pupil with asthma listed as a medical condition, where possible, has **at least two fully working inhalers** that are clearly labelled with both the pupil's name and school when they arrive. Children with asthma who do not have any required inhalers with them will not be able to take part in activities.

If you know your child suffers from travel sickness, please ensure they take the necessary precautions on the day of travel and send enough supplies for the return journey. Please clearly label the medication for the return journey. Again, these should be given to Mr Branch, in the office, on the morning of departure.

Bedding

Please note, all bedding is **NOT** provided so children will need to take a bottom sheet, pillowcase (pillows are provided) and duvet (with case) or sleeping bag.

To ensure that we have plenty of room to stow luggage on board the coach, we ask that children carry their duvet or sleeping bag separately to avoid unnecessary large luggage cases.

Luggage

Kit lists, providing details of what the children need have been previously sent out. Children should bring **one** medium-sized bag/case clearly labelled with their name and class, and ensure all belongings are labelled clearly. A carrier bag/rubbish bag for any wet clothing is advised. A small, **labelled water bottle** should also be brought with them.

Spending Money

There is a small shop on site and vending machines so children may bring up to a maximum of £15.00 spending money. Children will be responsible for their own money so please ensure it is put into an envelope or small purse/wallet for their safekeeping.

Electronic Gadgets

The programme the children will be following is action-packed and runs from early morning through to bedtime. While the children will have a small amount of free time, we would ask that children do not bring any electronic games, gadgets, cameras **or a mobile phone**.
