Preston CofE Primary School Accessibility Plan

This policy has been written with the underlying principles of a Church of England school, which applies to Preston C of E Primary School.

- 1. This Accessibility Plan has been drawn up in consultation with the Local Authority, pupils, parents, staff and directors/governors of the school.
- 2. We are committed to providing a fully accessible environment which values and includes all pupils, staff, parents and visitors regardless of their education, physical, sensory, social, spiritual, emotional and cultural needs. We are committed to challenging negative attitudes about disability and accessibility and to developing a culture of awareness, tolerance and inclusion.
- 3. The Trust plans, over time, will increase the accessibility of provision for all pupils, staff and visitors to the school. The Accessibility Plan will contain relevant actions to:
- Improve access to the physical environment of the school, adding specialist facilities as necessary. This covers improvements to the physical environment of the schools and physical aids to access education.
- Increase access to the curriculum for pupils with a disability, expanding the curriculum as necessary to ensure that pupils with a disability are as, equally, prepared for life as are the able-bodied pupils; (If a school fails to do this they are in breach of the DDA). This covers teaching and learning and the wider curriculum of the school such as participation in after- school clubs, leisure and cultural activities or school visits. It also covers the provision of specialist aids and equipment, which may assist these pupils in accessing the curriculum.
- Improve the delivery of written information to pupils, staff, parents and visitors with disabilities. Examples might include handouts, timetables, textbooks and information about the school and school events. The information should be made available in various preferred formats within a reasonable time frame.
- 5. Attached are Action Plans, relating to these key aspects of accessibility. These plans will be reviewed and adjusted on an annual basis. New Plans will be drawn up every 3 years.
- 6. We acknowledge that there is a need for ongoing awareness raising and training for staff and governors in the matter of disability discrimination and the need to inform attitudes on this matter.
- 7. The Accessibility Plan should be read in conjunction with the following policies, strategies and documents:

- 8. It may not be feasible to undertake some of the works during the life of this first Accessibility Plan and therefore some items will roll forward into subsequent plans.
- 9. As curriculum policies are reviewed, a section relating to access will be added to that on Equality and Diversity. The terms of reference for all governors' committees will contain an item on "having regard to matters relating to Access".

- 10. The School's Prospectus will make reference to this Accessibility Plan.
- 11. Information about our Accessibility Plan will be available to Parents
- 12. The Plan will be monitored by the Local Governing Bodies of the school.
- 13. The school will work in partnership with the local education authority and Diocesan Authority in developing and implementing this plan and will adopt in principle the Somerset Accessibility Strategy.
- 14. The Plan will be monitored by Ofsted as part of their inspection cycle.

Improving the Physical Access at Preston Primary School

An Access Audit is carried out by Head teacher/Site Manager/H&S Governor and H&S Compliance Officer resulting in a number of recommendations:

| Reception area | Accessible to children, parents and visitors. Front entrance has touch point disabled access. Desks are available at wheelchair height. | No further action. |
| Emergency escape routes | All classrooms and communal areas have a fire exit point with fire exit points clearly displayed. When the alarm sounds, fire escape doors and access points unlock automatically. All children or adults who require assistance are in receipt of a PEP (Personal Evacuation Plan). | PEPs generated as necessary. |
| Play equipment | Play equipment is suitable for children with physical needs e.g. lower level climbing frame. Play equipment to meet sensory needs is available. | Ongoing to meet needs of the pupils. |
