This letter is designed to provide key information about learning this term.

SUBJECT	CONTENT
English	This term ,we will be focusing on stories from other cultures using traditional Indian tales to link with our Geography topic on India. The children will also have the opportunity to explore a range of poetry and non-fiction texts. We will continue to consolidate reading comprehension skills using a variety of texts. Throughout the term, the children will broaden their understanding of grammatical techniques and devices.
Mathematics	Following the Year 4 Mathematical National Curriculum objectives, children will learn to; ◆ To use formal written methods for multiplication, subtraction, addition and division. ◆ To understand decimals, fractions, converting units of measure and negative numbers. We will also be teaching strategies to help the children apply their skills and knowledge to real life situations as well as developing their mental maths capabilities. ◆ There will be an ongoing focus will also be given to mental recall of all times tables.
Science	<u>States of matter:</u> Children will become aware of the different states of matter: solids, liquids and gases. They will also learn about how these states relate to the water cycle. <u>Sound and vibration:</u> Children will look at how sounds are made and recognise the process of how we hear vibration in our ears. They will consider the impact of pitch, volume and distance on sound.
Computing	<u>Programming:</u> Children will develop skills to modify a count-controlled loop to produce a given outcome . <u>Data logging:</u> To use a digital device to collect data automatically. <u>E-Safety:</u> Children will consider all aspects of E-Safety to keep themselves safe online.
Geography	<u>India Study:</u> Children will look at a case study of India. They will develop their map skills as well as learning about the education, work and daily life of people in a range of different locations across India. Children will make comparisons between life in India and life at home inc. religion and culture.
History	<u>The Stone Age:</u> Children will learn about the chronology of the Stone Age within the wider historical context. They will explore daily life for people and the importance of stone.
RE	<u>Hinduism:</u> Linking to our Geography topic on India, children will explore Hinduism. As part of this, they will be look at different Hindu Gods and how Hindus worship inc. key festivals and celebrations.
Music	<u>Scores</u> — Children will learn to create a graphic score and compose with a theme. <u>Play Practice</u> — The children will be involved in a production this term.
Art	<u>Painting: Light and Dark</u> — Children will understand that using lighter and darker tints and shades of a colour can create a 3D effect. <u>Sculpture: Mega Materials</u> - To know that simple 3D forms can be made by creating layers.
DT	<u>Textiles:</u> Children will create and design a book fastening. <u>Food:</u> Children will adapt an existing recipe.
PE	<u>Swimming:</u> Children will develop their swimming techniques and strokes. <u>Games:</u> To develop the skills of competitive games through tennis and football.
PSHE/RSE	<u>Keeping safe:</u> Children will learn to manage risks. <u>Rights and responsibilities:</u> Children will learn how they can make a difference in the world.
