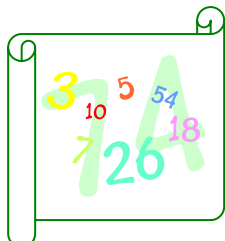

Dear Parents

This letter is designed to provide key information about learning this term.

SUBJECT	CONTENT
English	As directed by the English National Curriculum objectives, children will be focusing on poetry with its use of simile and personification. The children will be comparing poems, writing their own examples and learning verses to perform. We will explore a range of other text types including play scripts and recounts. The children will continue to consolidate their reading strategies and comprehension of a variety of texts and answer questions based upon them. We will also revise previous learning and broaden understanding of grammatical techniques and devices.
Maths	Following the Year 4 Mathematical National Curriculum objectives, children will focus on: ◆ Number and place value inc. numbers to 100, hundredths and tenths. ◆ Fractions inc. equivalents, simplifying, ordering and fractions of a shape. ◆ Measures inc. converting measurements, analogue and digital clocks and capacity. ◆ Geometry inc. properties of shape, irregular and regular polygons, 3D shapes and direction for grid ref. ◆ Statistics inc. bar charts and pictograms. ◆ Addition, subtraction, multiplication and division inc. problems.
Science	<u>Living things and their habitats:</u> Children will develop an understanding of different habitats and learn how to classify organisms and how animals have adapted to suit their environments. <u>Animals inc. humans:</u> Children will learn about the human digestive system inc. food chains and ecosystems.
Computing	<u>Programming:</u> Children will use Scratch to create games. <u>Multimedia:</u> Children will create an electronic comic. <u>TIOL (Technology In Our Lives):</u> Children will use programmes to check facts. <u>E-Safety:</u> Children will agree on class internet rules and safety as well as look at cyberbullying.
Geography	<u>Restless earth—earthquakes and volcanoes:</u> Children will learn how mountains and volcanoes are formed, the local environment and climate in the surrounding area; they will also understand why earthquakes occur.
History	<u>Ancient Egypt:</u> Children will explore Egyptian beliefs about life and death, and the ideas behind the tombs, pyramids and burial sites. They will learn about farming and how life in Egypt depended on the Nile. The unit will culminate with a visit to the British Museum in London, followed by an Egyptian art showcase to the whole school.
RE	<u>Hinduism:</u> Children will learn that Hinduism is one of the world's oldest religions and that Hindus believe in one God who is understood in many different forms. They will explore important Hindu stories, festivals such as Diwali, and symbols like the Om. They will also learn how Hindus show their faith through worship at home and in the mandir (temple).
Music	<u>Musical structures & Exploring feeling when you play:</u> Children will learn to understand music through focusing on tempos, rhythmic and melodic patterns through a range of songs and instruments.
Art	<u>Drawing—Power prints:</u> Children will explore pencil tones and shading and use charcoal to show areas of light and dark. They will focus on composition and include details such as contrast and patterns.
DT	<u>Slingshot sleighs:</u> Children will create a sleigh design and make a slingshot sleigh to test out over the Christmas period.
PSHE	<u>Me and my relationships:</u> Children will improve their understanding of healthy relationships and how to listen to feelings. In addition, they will look at the use of assertive skills and bullying. <u>Valuing differences:</u> Children will learn to recognise and celebrate differences inc. religion and cultural.
MFL	<u>Playtime/My home:</u> Children will be acquiring a proficiency in day-to-day French words and phrases. They will be using role-play to enhance their conversation skills, singing songs and using a variety of interactive activities.
PE	<u>Orienteering:</u> Children will work on co-ordination skills in various orienteering activities. <u>YTFC:</u> The children will also participate in a weekly PE lesson run by YTFC where they will learn many skills involving ball games and team sports.

Homework

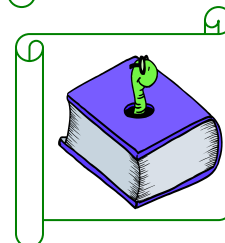


MATHS

This is to be brought in on a **Wednesday** please.

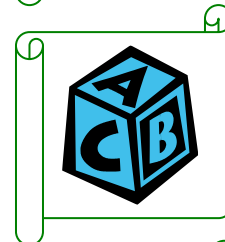
Times tables will be tested weekly with ongoing practice at home.

One piece of English homework will go home on a **Friday** reinforcing the work done in school during the week. This will be completed in CGP books.

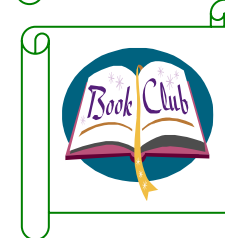
This is to be brought in on a **Wednesday** please.
